▼ TIPS

Our classes and athletic programs fill up very quickly - sometimes within a few minutes! We encourage you to, if you haven't already, set up a Community Schools account ahead of time to make registration quick and easy. Go to cs.cfsd16.org

NOTE: If you already have an account, you will simply log in, and update your account by clicking on the NEW 2022/2023 Registration button and make sure your info is current or updated.

- All students who signed up for Athletics are required to have a current sports physical and a completed
 athletic packet in order to participate. This must be turned in before they can attend a practice or participate
 in any games. Go to the REGISTER MY ATHLETE program, www.registermyathlete.com, and create an account.
 Here, you will download, sign and upload the forms to us for safe keeping. We will keep it on file for the
 entire school year, so you only have to do this once per school year.
- Class enrollment is ONLY available ONLINE. If a class or sport is full, you can be added to the wait list. You will be contacted if a spot becomes available to you.
- Study Hall is available for you to enroll in on a PER DAY basis. You will select which days you need on the calendar for as far out as you would like to schedule. Registration is open until noon each day. Sign up a day in advance to avoid late fees, as same day registrations and/or drop-ins will result in a fee of \$15 plus the cost of class. If your child shows up to study hall, and is not enrolled (on the roster), he/she will be considered a "drop in" which will incur a \$15 fee per occasion.







2022-2023 Athletic Packet Instructions

NOTE: This is just for the Athletic Packet - You will still need to enroll at <u>cs.cfsd16.org</u> to secure a spot on a team or a waitlist.

Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, athletic packet submissions, including physical examination documents will be turned in through "Register My Athlete."

Register My Athlete is an easy to navigate website that streamlines the process of submitting athletic paperwork. Parents create one account for all of their student athletes and can read, e-sign, print and upload all necessary paperwork. All athletes will be required to submit all forms through Register My Athlete before the first day of practice for their sport.

To access Register My Athlete and get started setting up an account, go to this link: **www.registermyathlete.com**.

If you have any difficulties setting up your account or trouble navigating the website, please contact Register My Athlete customer support at **support@registermyathlete.com**. They are very responsive during regular business hours and will get back to you as soon as possible.

NOTE: If you already use RMA at another school for another athlete, you can simply just log in and add a new athlete.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SET UP YOUR ACCOUNT IN REGISTER MY ATHLETE
